## Role, cont.

Two: Adhere to the Letter of the Law

- Ensure use of funds are allowed by law
- Fiscal accountability
- Good paper trails
- Avoid audit findings
- Maintain the credibility of the program
- Protect the dollars so they keep coming

# Goal

Maintain the quality that the program is known for:

- Don't break what isn't broken!!!!!
- Elements of quality:
  - 4-year structure
  - Viewed as an investment and a return on the investment
  - Emphasis on results, outcomes, sustainability
  - Evaluation findings to the legislature
  - Personal visits with grantees in their own operating environment

### 3-Year Trend - Disciplined Students

All Students by Action Taken Trend





- Over \$7 million in grants were awarded to 58 sites located in 48 of the 184 school districts/BOCES and in 4 facility schools.
- A projected \$18.1 million of per pupil revenue (PPR) was recaptured



- 10,082 students served
- 7,486 parents/guardians of these students were also served.
- 90% of students participated in an EARSS program because they were identified as at-risk of expulsion.

### 2009-10 Student Outcomes

2.9% dropout rate of at-risk students, lower than state rate of 3.6% for 2008-09.



#### 2009-10 Student Outcomes

- 86% of expelled students experienced positive outcomes
- 87% of at-risk student served experienced positive outcomes
- Positive Outcomes continue in school, completed program and transitioned back to school, graduated or obtained GED

  466,791 FY10 unobligated
  Total Available **\$7 015 034**
- Total Available \$7,015,934
- Number funded: 67
  - 1 private school
  - 4 BOCES
  - 9 facility schools
  - o 53 School districts (districts, schools, charters)
