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## **ASPIRE Core Components and Features**

ASPIRE consists of several structural components and features that supports its various uses.

- 1. A database of time series social and health indicator data organized at the county level
  - a. Data elements are published by secondary sources
  - b. Data are organized by issue categories
- 2. A database of program resources that includes source of funding, purpose of funding, funded organization, organization information
  - a. Non-profit dataset is populated with a GuideStar Extract and includes basic information such as NTEE code, revenues, etc.
  - b. Funding information entered directly by state and foundation funders
  - c. Funding streams are organized by issue categories
- 3. Output in the form of Tables, Graphs and Maps
- 4. Main Page Options open to the public
  - a. Document library
  - b. Web links
  - c. Quick Indicator Queries
  - d. Quick Resource Queries
  - e. Quick Resource Reports
  - f. Quick Indicator Reports (coming)
- 5. Community Pages for an additional fee
  - a. Customized front page, password protected
  - b. Features a-f above
  - c. Needs Assessment Module to create reports
  - d. Data Dashboard to display and track prioritized indicators
- 6. Under Development
  - a. Wiki Portal for communities to support collaboration and collaborative document authoring
  - b. Password protected data entry module for non-profits to annotate program information
  - c. Search screen to find service providers based on select criteria
