Unit 3: Increasing Child Engagement to Enhance Intervention	Individual or teams	Increasing child engagement can serve to improve behavior and social skills, as well as enhancing the effects of intervention. Different levels of child engagement, strategies to measure engagement, and strategies to increase engagement in all children are explored.	Recognize and rate levels of child engagement, work on room arrangement and scheduling staff to increase levels of child engagement
Unit 4: Embedded Instruction	Individual or teams	Children learn best within their natural environments.
