## Requirements around the NCLB Annual Report to the Public

### Under NCLB, districts that accept Title I funds must:

- Provide specific information about the district and its schools and how its students are performing to parents and the community.
- Information to the public should be in languages most understandable to families in the community.
- Districts have two options:
  - **1: Distributing Letter with Links**
  - 2: Distributing Full Report



### Option 1: Distributing Letter with Links

 District sends letters informing parents that annual report information has been compiled by CDE and is available on SchoolView at:

### www.schoolview.org/performance.asp

- Notification letters should:
  - Include specific directions for accessing information on the district and CDE websites;
  - Explain what kinds of information parents will find on these websites; and
  - Provide the name, telephone number and mailing address for parents who want to request printed copies.

### Option 1: Distributing Letter with Links

- The district must provide hard copies of the report information should upon request for people who do not have access to the internet or who prefer not to work on the internet.
- You may print these tables, available in SchoolView, as requests come in or compile them in advance, but they must be mailed out or available for pick-up in a timely fashion.



### NCLB Information that must be Reported by Title I Districts

Percent of students performing at each proficiency level for:

- Reading, Math, Writing, Science (TCAP, Lectura/Escritura, CSAPA)
- Each Grade Span (Elementary, Middle, High)
- The School, District and State overall and:
  - Separately by race/ethnicity and gender, English learners, and students who are low income, have disabilities, are migrants, and GT
  - Including two years of trend data.



### NCLB Information that must be Reported by Title I Districts

Percent of classes not taught by a highly qualified teacher, both overall and disaggregated by poverty level of students and percent minority.

The Transitional Colorado Assessment Program (TCAP) is Colorado's standards-based assessment designed to provide a picture of student performance to schools, districts, educators, parents and the community. It supports the transition from the Colorado Model Content Standards to the Colorado Academic Standards. The TCAP was administered for the first time in 2012. Prior to 2012, the Colorado Student Assessment Program (CSAP) was administered. Colorado's state assessments are comprised of the followina:

- CSAP/TCAP: reading, writing, math given in grades 3-10; science given in grades 5, 8, 10
- CSAP/TCAP Spanish language: reading and writing given in grades 3 and 4
- CSAPA/CoAlt: the alternate assessment given to students with the most significant cognitive disabilities; grades and subjects mirror those in TCAP/CSAP

- The 2012-2013 Annual Report will be due late summer 2013.
