Who should attend?

Teams from districts, schools, or BOCES are encouraged, and individuals are welcomed. Participants works together in teams.

Learn planning and instructional strategies to use with twiceexceptional students.

- How learning environment and teaching style influence student success
- Use of Response to Intervention (RtI) problem-solving model to analyze data from a variety of sources to identify:
 - o student strengths
 - o student needs
 - o potential interventions
 - o delivery options for twice exceptional students
- Strategies and resources to address both strengths and challenges
- How to collaborate with school or district team to develop:
 - o an educational plan for your own case study
 - o written learning plans (e.g., ALP, IEP, 504)
- Discuss various twice exceptional programming options in districts (large, small, urban, rural)
