Highlights

- Regional Resource Bank: The Metro Region gifted and talented directors and coordinators are in the process of creating a regional resource bank to support professional development needs for districts throughout the region. Areas identified thus far include: Arts ID support, Cluster Grouping, Cultural Understanding, Student Observation tools, Secondary Opportunities for gifted and talented and Elementary Opportunities for gifted and talented.
- GT Discussion Groups: Many GT coordinators have started GT discussion groups within their districts as a result of several recent training sessions with Terry Bradley. They report students are very enthusiastic and motivated to attend these classes that are held anywhere from once a week to once a month.
- Parent Surveys: Several metro districts have conducted gifted and talented parent surveys this year. Jefferson County in particular received over 1000 responses from parents of gifted and talented students. These parents gave high marks to the recent C-GER visit and the use of ALP's (Advanced Learning Plans) in the gifted and talented program.
- Masters in Gifted Big in Aurora: Aurora schools will soon have fifteen new teachers and staff members who have earned their Masters degree in gifted education through UNC.
