

Guidelines for Providing Evidence of ASCENT Student Eligibility

Issue Found	Methods for Providing Evidence
<p>The documentation provided did not illustrate the assessment scores. Therefore, we are unable to determine if the basic skills requirement is met based on the Statewide Remedial Education Policy minimum requirements for a student to enroll in college-level courses.</p>	<p>Provide ACT score documentation that student has scored 19 or higher in math, 18 or higher in writing and 17 or higher in reading.</p>
	<p>Provide SAT score documentation that student has scored 430 or higher on SAT Verbal for reading; 440 or higher on SAT Verbal for writing; 460 or higher on SAT Math.</p>
	<p>Provide Accuplacer score documentation that student has scored 85 or higher on Accuplacer Elementary Algebra; 95 or higher on Accuplacer Sentence Skills; 80 or higher on Accuplacer Reading Comprehension</p>
	<p>Provide evidence that the student has met one of the following criteria for exemption from assessment:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Has successfully completed a college-level mathematics and college-level writing course; or b. Has successfully completed necessary remedial course(s), if required, in mathematics, writing, and reading. <p>Note: Successfully completed refers to a student who earns a grade of C- or higher or a satisfactory completion.</p>
	<p>Provide evidence that student is enrolled in Career and Technical Education courses and does not need to meet SREP requirements. Evidence may include documentation of a student's:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Admission into CTE Certificate and or AAS program from the postsecondary institution b. Successful completion of Concurrent Enrollment coursework applicable to the postsecondary award path, and/or c. Verification of attainment of articulation agreement or Advanced Credit Pathway requirements.
<p>The transcripts provided did not clearly illustrate the student's postsecondary coursework completion, i.e. 12 credit hours must be on a college transcript. Note: International Baccalaureate (IB) and Advanced Placement and high school honors credits do not count towards postsecondary course work.</p>	<p>Provide high school course catalog that documents postsecondary coursework that would appear on college transcripts.</p>
	<p>Provide a list of all concurrent enrollment courses offered at the school.</p>
	<p>Provide a letter from the principal of the school that assures that the student has met 12 credit hour requirement.</p>
