SOWK 4712 : Law of Family and Child: Examines legal principles and procedures relevant to social work practice with families and children: structure and operation of American legal system, principles to follow in conducting legal research, basic principles of constitutional law and law related to juvenile delinquency, child protection, child adoption, education and domestic relations. Covers legal aspects of social work practice including licensing, confidentiality and professional liability. Successful completion counts toward GSSW's and Colorado's requirement for certification as a school social worker. An elective course in the High-Risk Youth Track. *3 qtr. hrs.*

SOWK 4715 : School Based Prevention and Early Intervention Strategies : Designed to give students the ability to identify, understand and apply the varied roles of school social workers. Examines the educational, organizational structure, special education laws and processes, collaborative team work with school, community professional and parents. Emphasis placed on meeting the needs of special education and general education population through intervention and on creating and maintaining preventive programs for children and youth. *3 qtr hrs.*
