Summary
<p>The National Institute for Excellence in Teaching (NIET) provides partial management at both the school-level and district-level, focused on district and school leadership with an emphasis on instructional improvement. The provider supports schools through its customized five-step process to conduct a needs assessment, set goals, develop a support plan, implement job-embedded training and coaching, and provide ongoing monitoring and support.</p>

Adequate	NIET describes two partnerships in state-wide school improvement efforts in Arizona and Louisiana--one with an institution of higher education, and one with a state education agency.
