




# Overview of Educational Accountability in Colorado





## Colorado's Accountability System

Based on Colorado statutory requirements...


- CDE annually evaluates districts and schools based on student performance outcomes and provides a common framework through which to understand performance and focus improvement efforts.
- All districts receive a District Performance Framework (DPF). This determines their accreditation rating. All schools receive a School Performance Framework (SPF). This determines their school plan types.
- Establishes a minimum set of performance expectations to focus support and resources from the state.











#### Performance Frameworks Reports and Unified Improvement Plans

District and School Performance Frameworks are used to determine performance ratings under the state accountability system. Unified improvement Plans document the strategies that districts and schools implement as part of the continuous improvement cycle. <u>Release/Refresh Timeline:</u> The final official Framework results are released in December. For most schools, UIPs are required to be submitted by April, but may be updated throughout the year.

#### School and District Dashboards

The Dashboards are made up of a suite of reports that have been designed to support improvement planning efforts by districts and schools. The dashboards allow users to interact with graphs and tables showing demographic information along with performance data and ratings generated under the state accountability system. Use this online tool to view current information for individual schools and districts along with several years of historical data.

<u>Release/Refresh Timeline</u>: Dashboards are refreshed with achievement and growth performance data each summer when state assessment results become available, and with framework information each December when ratings are finalized.
