Program Overview	<p>Generation Schools Network (GSN) in partnership with Battelle for Kids (BFK) and Colorado State University Global Campus (CSU Global) offers schools and districts a unique site and team-based approach to school turnaround leadership education that culminates in a Graduate Certificate in Turnaround Leadership for program participants and the opportunity to matriculate courses into CSU Global’s principal leadership program. The two-year program embeds needed supports and on-site coaching, engaging participants in a blended learning experience that builds team capacity to create a high-impact, student- centered learning environment supported by a strong and inclusive school culture.</p> <p>As part of this journey, education experts come alongside district and school- based teams of three or more whose schools need comprehensive or targeted support. The coach delivers course content and walks alongside to improve school performance ensuring critical inputs, perspectives and training for both leadership and teachers. Coursework is focused on learning and executing on the strategies critical to school success that are directly applicable to day-to-day school operations and instruction.</p> <p>Each team receives support through team building, vision casting, on-site coaching through UIP planning, problem solving, professional development and access to on-line courses, tools and assessments. Topics for study and implementation include identifying barriers and challenges to school success, addressing them through the innovative use of time, talent and resources, data teams and cycles, core instruction and integration of a multi-tiered system of supports, teacher collaborative practice, social/emotional learning and college/career readiness. Participating schools/districts receive access to Battelle for Kids’ Formative Instructional Practice (FIP) modules that have been demonstrated to dramatically improve educational outcomes in the classroom. FIP practices provide both the formal and informal ways that teachers and students gather and respond to evidence of student learning. It is a process in which leaders and teachers join in a cohesive approach to use tools, strategies, and resources to determine what students know, identify gaps in understanding, modify instruction and actively engage</p>
