## Overall Results

In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Colorado was 247 . This was higher than the average score of 241 for public school students in the nation.
The average score for students in Colorado in 2013 (247) was higher than their average score in 2011 (244) and in 1992 (221). The score gap between higher performing students in Colorado (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 39 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 ( 40 points).
The percentage of students in Colorado who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 50 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (47 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (17 percent).
The percentage of students in Colorado who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 87 percent in 2013. This percentage was greater than that in 2011 ( 84 percent) and in 1992 (61 percent).

Score Gaps for Student Groups
In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 29 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (28 points). In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 23 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (23 points). In 2013, male students in Colorado had an average score that was not significantly different from female students. In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 24 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1996 (23 points).

## Overall Results

In 2013, the average score of eighth-grade students in Colorado was 290 . This was higher than the average score of 284 for public school students in the nation.
The average score for students in Colorado in 2013 (290) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (292) and was higher than their average score in 1990 (267).
The score gap between higher performing students in Colorado (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 52 points in 2013. This performance gap was wider than that in 1990 ( 44 points).
The percentage of students in Colorado who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 42 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (43 percent) and was greater than that in 1990 (17 percent).
The percentage of students in Colorado who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 77 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (80 percent) and was greater than that in 1990 (57 percent).

## Score Gaps for Student Groups

In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 40 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1990 ( 36 points). In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 27 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1990 ( 27 points). In 2013, male students in Colorado had an average score that was not significantly different from female students. In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 30 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was wider than that in 1996 ( 23 points).

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
