
SY 2020-2021 English Language Proficiency Screener Assessment Guidance: Based on Instructional Setting



This guidance assists Colorado school districts and charter schools with identification of English Learners (ELs) for English Language Development (ELD) program eligibility during distance, in-person, or hybrid instruction related to educational disruptions due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In accordance with state (C.R.S. § 22-24-105) and federal (20 U.S.C. § 6311(b)2(G)) laws, Local Education Agency (LEA) providers are responsible for providing the state-approved annual English language proficiency assessment, ACCESS for ELLs, to all English learners identified through Standardized or Interim procedures outlined in this document.



Students receiving distance instruction during SY 2020-2021

In cases when students are participating in distance learning, and in-person and/or hybrid instruction cannot be provided in a way that adheres to state and local health and safety guidance, districts and charter schools must use the Colorado Interim Identification Procedures (www.cde.state.co.us/cde_english/covid19andclde) to identify EL students for ELD programming. Note: Department of Education Fact Sheet: Providing Services to English Learners during the COVID-19 Outbreak (www.cde.state.co.us/cde_english/covid19andclde) outlines inperson screening to confirm provisional EL identification will be required when in-person instruction occurs*.

Students receiving in-person instruction during SY 2020-2021

In cases when students are participating in in-person instruction, districts and charter schools must use the <u>Colorado Standardized Identification Procedures</u> (www.cde.state.co.us/cde_english/identification-placement) to identify EL students for ELD programming and administer in-person ELP screener assessments*: <u>Kindergarten W-APT and/or WIDA Screener</u> (www.cde.state.co.us/cde_english/english-language-proficiency-assessment).

Students receiving hybrid instruction during SY 2020-2021

In cases when students are participating in hybrid instruction (combination of in-person and distance learning and activities), districts and charter schools must use the <u>Colorado Standardized Identification Procedures</u> (www.cde.state.co.us/cde_english/identification-placement) and administer in-person screening assessments: <u>Kindergarten W-APT and/or WIDA Screener</u> (www.cde.state.co.us/cde_english/english-language-proficiency-assessment), on days when students attend in-person instruction*.

^{*}Districts and charter schools should attempt a good faith effort to reassess the student's English language proficiency to confirm provisional identification when possible. When in-person screening of provisionally identified ELs is not possible and students have participated in ACCESS for ELLs in 2021, scores can be used to confirm/refute EL identification.
