WHEREAS, having competency in diverse languages and cultures enhances pupils' literacy and numeracy skills, leading to increased achievement on both verbal and quantitative tests; and

WHEREAS, the study of languages and cultures affords the unique opportunity to gain insight into the history, heritage, and perspectives of all Coloradans as well as other communities around the globe and increases understanding and encourages respect for people of different backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, the Lead With Languages campaign was established to highlight the value of learning languages and cultures; and

WHEREAS, the bipartisan bill that establishes a Seal of Literacy, which recognizes Colorado high school graduates who are proficient in a second language, was signed into law by Governor Hickenlooper; and

WHEREAS, a Colorado world languages educator, Ms. Heather Witten, a Spanish teacher at Elizabeth High School, was recently named to the Colorado Congress of Foreign Language Teachers' Teacher of the Year.
