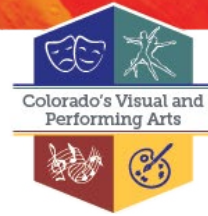
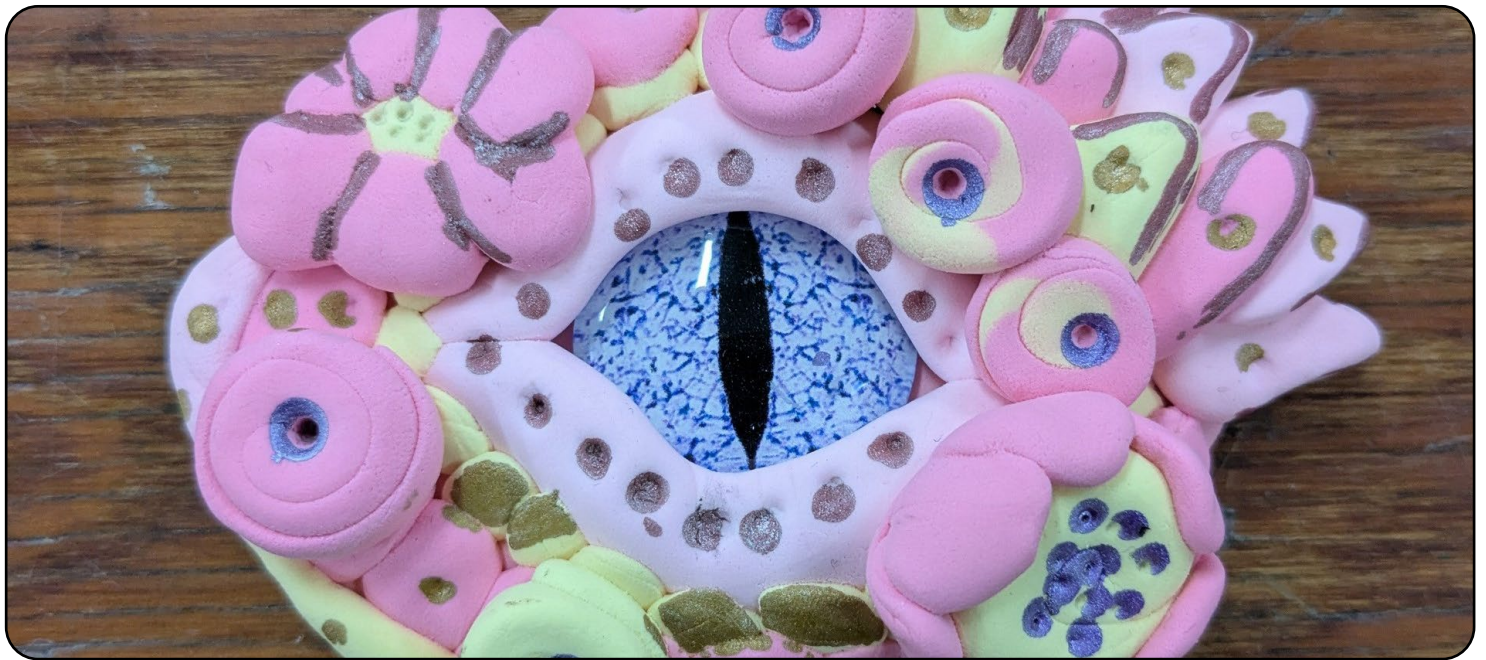

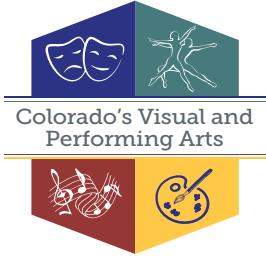

Colorado Standards Revision

In 2008, the Colorado legislature passed a law requiring each content standard to follow a six-year revision cycle. The Arts and Social Studies revision cycles are quickly approaching, and we are preparing for our next round of standards revisions that will take place in 2027 and 2028.

TIMELINE AND WAYS TO GET INVOLVED:

We will keep updating this timeline as new dates approach.

Spring 2026:

We are currently conducting a national benchmarking report to compare Colorado's standards with state, national, and international standards. This work is being completed by members of the State Education Agency Directors of Arts Education ([SEADAE](#)).

Fall 2026:

A survey will be released in the fall to gain public feedback on the current standards. We encourage all stakeholders to participate and share any desired changes for upcoming revisions. **Please watch your inboxes for this survey in the coming months.**

Winter 2026/27:

The Colorado State Board of Education will review the public feedback and benchmarking report and determine whether revisions will move forward.

CDE will begin accepting applications for standards review committee members during this time. These committees will take part in the standards review process throughout 2027 and 2028. **If you are interested in participating, consider applying to serve on a content-specific committee next winter.**

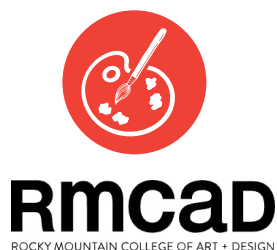
