

Shakespeare and Violence Prevention

The Colorado Shakespeare Festival is offering the Shakespeare & Violence Prevention program in a hybrid format for the 2021-22 school year. The program offers schools access to a filmed performance (a 30-minute Twelfth Night for grades 3-5, or a 45-minute Julius Caesar for grades 6-12), filmed onsite at CSF's historic Mary Rippon Outdoor Theatre in compliance with local public health guidelines. The actors from the production are available to lead classroom workshops (in-person or virtual), unpacking the patterns of violence and roleplaying solutions. The program integrates research from the Center for the Study and Prevention of Violence, aligns with 2020 Education Standards, and brings professional actors

into your (virtual) classroom. Includes a study guide (available in English and Spanish), captioned performances for students to watch at their own pace, and a prerecorded workshop for students unable to attend the real-time lesson with the actors. Theatre Counts! A Special Report

Theatre education can help young people develop a strong sense of self and identity, build empathy and learning among peers and broaden the ways they make meaning of the world around them. Yet the last comprehensive arts education study, examining the state of art education during the 2008-09 school year, found that only 4% of all public elementary schools offered theatre instruction, and

less than 50% of public secondary schools offered theatre instruction during the school day. Additional data from a 2012 Americans for the Arts report suggest that fewer schools offered theatre courses during the school day (79% sampled) than offer extracurricular theatre (95% sampled). addition, wealthier students are more likely to receive theatre education during the school day (41-56%) than students in schools with higher concentrations of poverty (28%). These numbers highlight a general lack of access to theatre education and underline the need for continued research and data collection. Read more...
