# STANDARDS AND INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPORT

#### **Standards Review and Revision Committee Process**

CDE recently conducted an open and transparent standards development process by engaging educators, business leaders, representation from higher education and parents in standards development committees. The department solicited committee participation through an online application process for each of the five content areas in Group 1. Applicants were required to demonstrate their content area expertise and willingness to serve. Applications were reviewed using a blind-review process, considering only the applicants' qualifications. Each of the standards development committees chose chair/co-chairs to guide the meetings. CDE content specialists staffed the committees and will meet with the chair/co-chairs to plan future meetings and ensure consistency across committee work plans. All meetings will be open to the public and all meeting notes will be shared with the State Board of Education and posted on the CDE website. Committee members will be expected to participate in all meetings (5-6 will take place) in addition to completing work between meetings. Committee work for Group 1 will commence in May 2021 and conclude in June 2022. <u>Click here</u> to view the revision committees.
