

Save the Date! Northeastern CoLab May 2024

In cooperation with the Northeast BOCES and Northeastern Junior College, the 2024 Teaching and Learning CoLab will be held in Sterling on May 29-30. Teaching and Learning CoLabs are locally hosted, multi-disciplinary events following a model developed and supported by the Colorado Department of Education. These events are focused on teaching and learning and are designed for collaboration. Each CoLab brings together stakeholders in K-12, higher education, Colorado's professional teaching organizations, and the Colorado Department of Education. Schools are encouraged to form teams with teachers spanning across grades and content areas, along with instructional coaches, curriculum specialists, and building-level administrators. A target attendance is approximately 200 attendees, with a balance of elementary teachers, secondary teachers, administrators, and others who support teaching and learning.

Institute for Creative Teaching (ITC) June 11-13 at UNC

These sessions are designed to enhance teaching techniques and deepen understanding of narrative and fictional world creation. This approach aims to transform trauma-informed practices, culturally responsive teaching, and engagement with diverse learners. A special feature of this year's Institute is an interactive learning experience with Meow Wolf, known for their immersive storytelling. Attendees will receive 24 hours of continuing education toward re-licensure, rich in narrative and creativity. There's also an option to earn 1 graduate credit hour from UNC for a small additional fee. EdTA Theatre Curriculum Framework

The EdTA Theatre Curriculum Framework Project was introduced in 2019, the result of a yearlong project funded in part by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. Teams of secondary theatre educators and teaching artists from around the nation collaborated with EdTA facilitators to create units of instruction and to work to frame best practice in theatre education. The conceptual framework articulates a structure emphasizing mastery of commonly agreed upon elemental knowledge and skills: what students **need** to know rather than what's **nice** to know. This mastery is further guided by sequential pre-K-12 standards-based instruction leading to artistic literacy. Click here to learn more and to access the Defining Elements and Principles.



NAfME's Small Schools Initiative

Teaching music at small schools affords unique opportunities and benefits, while also presenting specific challenges. NAfME's <u>Small Schools Initiative</u> was started by Tom Muller, Immediate Past President of NAfME's Northwest Division. Starting its work in February 2023, the Task Force identifies key issues and

effective strategies for networking, community building, professional learning, advocacy, and resource development to support music educators in small schools throughout the United States, primarily but not exclusively serving in rural contexts. The Task Force meets regularly to discuss priority issues and plan outreach and support for small school music educators including through surveys, research, articles, resources, town halls and other types of professional learning.
