COVID-19 READ Act Updates

READ Plans



Districts are encouraged to provide targeted learning opportunities for students on READ plans aimed at accelerating reading growth to the extent practicable by the constraints of the remote learning environment.

READ plans should be updated using the most current interim data available (MOY) and progress monitoring data available (this will vary by school/district).

READ Act Budget Updates







The deadline to submit Fiscal Year 2020-21 READ budget projections is **June 30, 2020.**

Required Evidence-Based Training for K-3 Teachers





Definition of Teacher



The <u>Rules for the Administration of the READ Act</u>, 1 CCR 301-92 (2.36), define **teacher** as:

The professional responsible for the literacy instruction of the student(s) and may include the main instructor for a class, an instructional coach, reading interventionist, special education teacher, Title I teacher or other personnel who are identified as effective in the teaching of reading.

If additional staff (beyond statute requirements) can take the CDE-provided training at no cost will be determined later.



Completion of Evidence-Based Training in Teaching Reading

To meet this training requirement, State Board of Education rules require that the evidence-based training in teaching reading must:

- Consist of a minimum of 45 hours;
- Address the content of the educator preparation literacy standards referenced in the state board's Rules for the Administration of Educator License Endorsements, 1 CCR 301-101, section 4.02(5) through 4.02(12) (effective May 30, 2019); and
- Include an end of course assessment that teachers can provide evidence of passing.

The K-3 Teacher Evidence-Based Reading Training Requirements webpage lists more detailed information.







The <u>State Board of Education approved</u> **Praxis Teaching Reading: Elementary 5205** as "a test that teachers may take to demonstrate their understanding of evidence-based reading instruction."

Teachers who score at least 159 on the ETS Praxis Teaching Reading Elementary assessment (5205) will have met the evidence-based teacher training requirement established in SB19-199.



Praxis Test at Home



Taken from the ETS Praxis Tests at Home webpage:

ETS is temporarily offering select Praxis® tests at home while many test centers are closed or have limited seating. To help as many test takers as possible, we are only offering the most frequently administered tests for at home delivery. The tests are identical in content, format and on-screen experience to the Praxis tests taken at a test center. They are taken on your own computer at home or another secure location and monitored by a human proctor online through ProctorU®. At home appointments are currently available 15 hours a day, seven days a week to address the scheduling needs of candidates across the United States and its territories.

ETS anticipates opening registration for Praxis Test at Home in Teaching Reading: Elementary 5205 in early June.

- Trainer








The <u>application for district-provided professional development</u> to meet the K-3 teacher training requirement is posted on the CDE website.

- Application are accepted on a rolling basis, so a district/BOCES can submit their professional development to be reviewed at any time.
- CDE will make every effort to review two applications a month beginning August 2020.
- Applications will be reviewed in the order they are received.

Advisory List of Professional Development Programs Advisory List Updated

The <u>READ Act professional development advisory list</u> has been updated and posted on the CDE website.

- The advisory list includes professional development that will meet the K-3 teacher training requirements.
- The application to submit professional development for review was released only to vendors of professional development that were previously approved and on the READ Act Professional Development Advisory List.
- The application will be released publicly to all interested applicants in the future.

Advisory List of Instructional Programs

Review Process Update

The <u>READ Act instructional programming advisory list</u> has been updated and posted on the CDE website.

- The spring 2020 review process has been interrupted due to COVID-19.
 Not all programs have been reviewed.
- CDE is currently working to complete the review process.
- The review process includes a window for vendor appeal.
- Programs that have been reviewed and approved during the spring 2020 review process are now posted. The list has been updated at least once since initial posting.





Moving Forward

- CDE will continue to review the programs that were not completed.
- Once all programs have been reviewed and after the appeal process, additional programs may be posted.
- Review material templates will be posted (e.g. rubric templates, applications).
- Stakeholders may request rubrics of reviewed programs once the list is finalized.
 - To assess local next steps
 - To seek guidance from the department


