OVERVIEW

Youth Mental Health First Aid USA is an eight- hour public education program that introduces participants to the observable risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems in adolescents, builds understanding of the importance of early intervention and teaches individuals how to help an adolescent in crisis or who is experiencing a mental health challenge. Mental Health First Aid uses role-playing and simulations to demonstrate how to assess a crisis; select interventions and provide initial help; and connect young people to professional, peer, social and self-help care.

Mental Health First Aid USA is coordinated by the National Council for Behavioral Health. Experts at the National Technical Assistance Center for Children's Mental Health at the Georgetown University Center for Child and Human Development helped develop the program.

FUNDING AND CONTEXT

Limited funding for Youth Mental Health First Aid classes is available through the Colorado Department of Education (CDE) Project AWARE Grant. CDE can provide funding for certified instructors. Securing funding for course manuals is the requester's responsibility. Grant objectives encourage that the target audience for the trainings be youth-serving adults who work primarily with the 12-18 age range.

Common target audiences can include:

- Teachers
- Para-professionals or Para-educators
- School administrators
- Transportation staff
- Athletic coaches and physical education staff
- School support staff (monitors, cafeteria staff, janitorial staff, tutor, after- school programs)
- Juvenile justice or corrections
- School Nurses
- First responders police, firefighters, emergency health)
- Spiritual or religious leader or support

Project AWARE funds Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) trainings across the state to improve literacy around mental health. These funds are available to train youth-serving adults who interact with middle schooland high school-aged students.
