This program will serve students enrolled in grades K-3 who have significant reading deficiencies. Our summer school literacy program will also invite those students who are below grade level, should space be available. The program will use the following resources for instruction: HD Word, CKLA Amplify Reading K-3, Really Great Reading and BLAST.

The summer school literacy program will use scientifically based or evidence based instructional programming in reading that:
