Read Act dollars will be used as part of Title 1 Teacher's salary. The Title 1 Teacher is a reading interventionist who is trained in the science of reading and in teaching the foundational reading skills. Students who are SRD or who have previously been identified as needing reading intervention, will work with the Title 1 Teacher. The teacher will provide SIPPS and/or Sound Partner intervention to SRD students daily for at least 30 minutes. Intervention groups will be small in size or one-on-one to specifically target student needs. Title 1 teacher will work closely with the classroom teacher to determine progress of student. Title 1 teacher will also monitor student progress from Mastery Tests and DIBELS 8 Progress Monitoring data to ensure student growth.

READ Act funds will be used to provide other targeted, evidence-based or scientifically based intervention services to students who are receiving instructional services, which services are approved by the department
