Lindamood Bell Visualizing and Verbalizing Curriculm. We have identified a strong need to provide extra support to our struggling readers, especially those on READ plans. With over 60 students at one point on read plans with only one reading interventionist, the workload is simply too much. We have hired an additional (1.0FTE) K-5 Reading Interventionist to help identify the gap in our students' reading performance, especially those in grades k-3. These two reading interventionists will work closely together in identifying, progress monitoring and working with the teachers/staff to address the reading deficiencies of our Elementary students. The interventionists will be using a variety of READ act approved programs while pulling students out for targeted reading. We will be using Istation, Lexia, Benchmark and local assessments along with progress monitoring and early screeners to help collect relevant data. Our goals this year are to create a consistent and equitable pull-out schedule for our interventionists. Another goal will be to be able to monitor progress with fidelity and utilize two employees to focus on an area that we seem to have more students struggling in than succeeding. We would like to see our students that have been on read plans show at least one year of growth in reading for the 23-24 school year.
