According to STAR early literacy pre assessment student data in the fall, we have identified that students entering kindergarten are missing some or most of the five aspects of the reading process. In addition, we have determined that small group targeted classroom interventions are successful if adequately supported with appropriate staffing. The additional classroom support will provide opportunities for the kindergarten teachers to provide OG Yoshimoto and Michael Heggerty Phonemic Awareness instructional lessons to students in a small group setting. Pre Assessments determined the strengths and weaknesses of the 5 aspects of the reading process. Small group instruction will include phonics, phonemic awareness, vocabulary, reading comprehension and fluency. These five aspects work together to create the reading experience and the target instruction will support student content mastery. As children learn to read they must develop skills in all five of these areas in order to become successful readers. The small group instruction will be differentiated based on student needs. The expected outcome and/or goals will be for all students in kindergarten to have the basic essential skills to become fluent readers as measured by STAR early literacy benchmark assessments. Students will make more than one year's growth as measure by end of the year STAR early literacy screenings.
