Detail of plans with named programs -- A combination of READ Act Approved programs will be used by interventionists to address specific skill deficits and provide instruction to targeted needs: Heggerty for phonological awareness, OG for Phonics, Read Naturally for Fluency, SIPPs for a combined skill program. Expected outcomes/goals -- The goal of targeted intervention programming is for students to make growth expectations on DIBELs and iReady to show they are closing the gap of their individual reading deficiencies compared to grade level standards.
