Eads Elementary will conduct summer school in 2024 to extend the school year for students who have a reading deficiency (red or yellow) based on DIBELS 8th End of Year Benchmark data. The students will continue interventions from the school year using Sipps, Sound Partners, and Corrective Reading. These curriculums will be taught explicitly and help accelerate individual student reading. This will help students maintain their learning to continue to the next school year. This money will be used to pay salaries for summer school teachers.

The summer school literacy program will use scientifically based or evidence based instructional programming in reading that:
