\$5,772.50 The District will Purchase the I-Ready Assesment Reading Program to be used to test and progress monitor students in Grades K-3. This will allow the instructors to do a better job of progress monitoring as the students will be able to take assessments with in the classroom limiting the time pulled out for one on one testing. The program will include personalized instruction to meet individual students needs based on test scores. The expected outcome will be to increase monitor progress and quicker identification of reading deficencies and develop immediate specific individualized plans to address reading deficencies. By quicker intervention the expectation is for students to achieve growth sooner. \$2,605.50 The District will purchase additional supports materials for intervention services for students that have significant reading deficencies in Grades K-3
