Core Reading: The instructional program used for summer school is Into Reading which is the material the District uses to support the Reading Writing Framework Student Evidence Outcomes for grades K-3 which are all student product based. However, we do purchase additional materials such as LETRS, BLAST and AMPLIFY to maximize growth/achievement of all students. All materials are on the Advisory List of Programming. 3. Other Services: Re-1 Valley uses READ funds to partially fund K-3 literacy coaches and instructional coaches to assure student growth/achievement in all classrooms.
