Looking at school data as measured by Acadience Reading assessement, several students are identified as having a significant reading deficiency. To address this, the school has adopted several evidence based curriculums for tier 1 instruction as well as additional targeted intervention curriculum for Tier 2 and 3 support. At the universal instructional level, teachers use the Heggerty Phonological Awareness Curriculum, Fundations for phonics instruction and EL for Language Arts. Tier 2 and 3 instruction is based on 95% Group targeted interventions and Heggerty Interventions. Students identified as SRD receive 25 minutes of small group of 1:1 instruction 4 days per week the 5th day is reseverved for progress monitoring. The expected outcome is for 80% or more students to be reading at 95% fluency or better by the end of 3rd grade.
