We have adopted new curriculum and are in year 3 of implementation. Our curriculum is comprehensive and includes Heggerty, Fundations, Geodes, and Wit & Wisdom. Some funds are used to supplement the essential materials of these curricula. Since adopting, we are identifying the appropriate intervention compliments to the core instruction. At this time we have Wilson Fundations, Wilson Just Words, and Wilson Reading System in our intervention options, We use read funds to resupply these curricular tools and to select complimentary resources such as decodable text for young readers.
