Our students with SRD level reading will benefit from a Jump Start summer reading program. We will run a two week "Jump Start" summer school program for grades k-3. The funds will be used for salaries for an instructor and to provide transportation for students. Our instructor is trained in scientific approved reading programs. These programs are Heggerty phonological awareness program, SIPP's, Core 5 Reading subscription, and Wonders intervention programs. With these proven programs we should be able to help students increase their reading skills for the 2023-2024 school year.
