The number of students identified SRD since 2016 is remained mostly the same, around 15%. In 2019, the district richased and implemented CKLA for its approved core curriculum. It is believe that ongoing training and support is needed for teachers, decially in regards to planning and utilizing best instructional actices for all students K-3. READ funds will pay for the cost of two lift day trainings in August and January for the use and planning of EAA with all classroom teachers. We expect that student reading officiency scores will increase and the number of students identified SRD will decrease over time as more training and implementation opport is provided. Funds will also support training and license richases for approved supplemental programs from Really Great adding.

A portion of funds will be used to provide an instructional coach for K-3 classroom teachers. The coach will be a literacy specialist who has completed all required READ Act trainings. Since the number of students who are identified SRD has not decreased and based on multiple classroom observations and planning sessions, informal data shows that teachers are not planning and implementing approved core and supplemental programs with the level of intention necessary. The instructional coach will support teams by facilitating team planning sessions for grades K-3, observing CKLA lessons and providing timely and relevant feedback.
