In mid-2022-23, there were 148 udents on READ plans. Most of those were in grades K-3 where ere are 118 students one or more grade levels behind in iReady eading on the Winter 2022-23 Benchmark. Most students who are ore than 1 year behind are still struggling in Phonological wareness. Our plan to address students who are 1 year or more whind and are on a READ plan is to provide small group Direct eading Instruction around the 5 components of reading. We will have ualified Interventionists at all three elementary schools to support ad instruct students. Teachers will use and access district approved upplemental materials such as Orton Gillingham, Heggerty, Sterling teracy and iReady lessons to address early reading skills as well as
