STUDENT ATTENDANCE

School is back in session! School leaders, faculty and staff are welcoming students and their families and planning for a successful school year. A first step in getting this school year off to a positive start is creating awareness and understanding of the importance of daily attendance.

REGULAR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE MATTERS

- Missing only two days a month can set students behind in their education.
- Often students who miss seven to nine days per semester, (or 10 percent or more of days) face serious hurdles in getting to school, such as ongoing health concerns, lack of a safe path to school or bullying.
- Irregular attendance can be a better predictor of whether students will drop out before graduation than test scores.
- Research links school attendance to *student engagement*, which refers to a student's sense of belonging, safety and involvement in school and plays a role in academic achievement.

COLORADO ATTENDANCE HIGHLIGHTS

Take a closer look at Colorado's performance in attendance!

- Districts annually report on incidence of attendance and truancy. In the future, additional data will be available on chronic absenteeism, which includes a count of students who miss 10 percent of the school days in which they were enrolled in the school, regardless of whether absences are excused or unexcused.
- "Habitually truant" count pertains to the number of students of compulsory school attendance age (6 through 16) who have had four unexcused absences in one month or 10 unexcused absences in one school year.
- Colorado has seen an alarming increase in the number of habitual truant students since 2013-14.

State Attendance Rate

- 2013-14 - 93.6%
- 2014-15 - 93.2%
- 2015-16 - 93.3%
- 2016-17 - 92.9%

State Truancy Rates

- 2013-14 - 2.2%
- 2014-15 - 2.4%
- 2015-16 - 2.5%
- 2016-17 - 2.7%

Best Practices for Increasing Attendance

There are a variety of approaches that support the regular school attendance rate. Click on a link to read more about them.

- **Focus on the ninth-grade**
Improvements in long-term outcomes come from focusing on students' ninth-grade year.
- **Focus on middle school**
Students' middle school attendance rate and GPA are the best indicators to determine high school success.
- **Parent engagement**
Engaging parents in their child's educational career is a key strategy in improving attendance and academic performance.
- **School-based health centers**
School-based health centers and interventions have a direct impact on educational outcomes, like attendance.
