# CARES Act Certification of Participation in Equitable Services to Non-public Schools

The CARES Act requires calculation of the amount to be made available for equitable services in the same manner as provided under Section 1117 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965. Under ESEA, LEAs provide "equitable services" to non-public school students and teachers by allocating a proportionate share of ESEA funds to non-public schools. The proportionate share used to provide equitable services to non-public schools under the CARES Act is based on the number of low income students that reside within the district that attend the non-public school.

During consultation, the LEA discussed the methodology used to determine equitable services and explained the allowable activities available under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) and agreed on how to obtain equitable services under CARES Act funding.

In addition to the method of distribution and allowable activities, the non-public school and LEA discussed the amount of funding available for allowable activities and how that amount was calculated, how, where and by whom the services will be provided, the service delivery mechanism and whether services will be provided directly by the LEA or through a separate agency, consortium, entity or third party contractor, and any LEA fiscal policies for the provision of services. The non-public school understands that CARES Act funds remain in public control; reimbursement of expenses is prohibited, the equitable services and other benefits provided by the LEA including materials and equipment must be secular, neutral, and nonideological and will comply with all applicable program and/or fiscal reporting requirements.
