- ☐ Involve parents in the planning, review and improvement of the school parent and family engagement policy
- ☐ *If applicable (Title I, Part A Schoolwide Programs)* Involve parents and families in the joint development of the schoolwide programs plan
- ☐ Provide parents of students participating in Title I, Part A services, programs or activities:
  - o Timely information about Title I, Part A Programs
  - A description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the Title I school, the forms of academic assessments used to measure student progress, and the achievement levels of the Colorado State Academic Standards
  - If requested by parents, opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and opportunities to participate in decisions relating to the education of their student
