Twice Exceptional Level 2 Training

WHO: Educators, specialists, and mental health support who have taken the 2e foundations course or who are knowledgeable about gifted students and who want to go deeper into the needs of 2e students.

WHAT: Online one-week professional learning on Twice-Exceptionality

WHEN & WHERE: June 14 – June 20, 2020 – Online

Assignments include *readings, video viewing, discussion posts, and a dual-differentiated learning plan*. Participants are expected to complete all assignments within one week.

- The amount of time required is approximately *fifteen hours*.
- The final grade is Pass/No Credit. A score of 80% is required to pass.
- This course uses the Moodle platform and is housed on [CDE LMS platform](#).

This course is designed to provide you with the ability to

- investigate the potential challenges faced by gifted students with learning challenges such as autism spectrum disorder, specific learning disabilities, and attention deficit disorder,
- use data to inform instructional programming decisions,
- collaborate with others to further develop educational plans that will be responsive to a student's profile, and
- review resources to support dual-differentiation, rigor, and strength-based programming.
