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

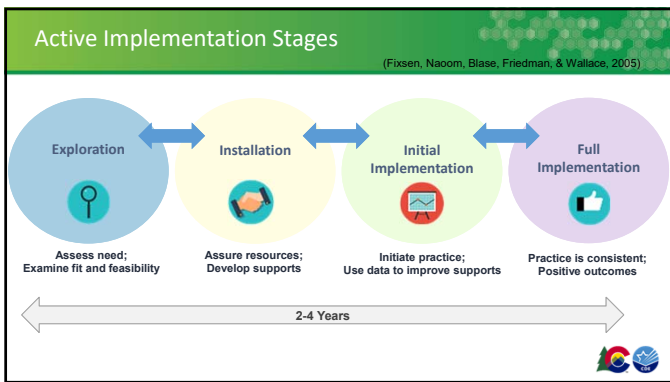
Sameer Hinduja¹ · Justin W. Patchin²

- Positive parenting (warmth, structure, autonomy/support) linked to lower bullying and cyberbullying perpetration
- Negative parenting (rejection, chaos, coercion) linked to higher levels of bullying and cyberbullying perpetration
- Parental influence is stronger on cyberbullying compared to traditional bullying

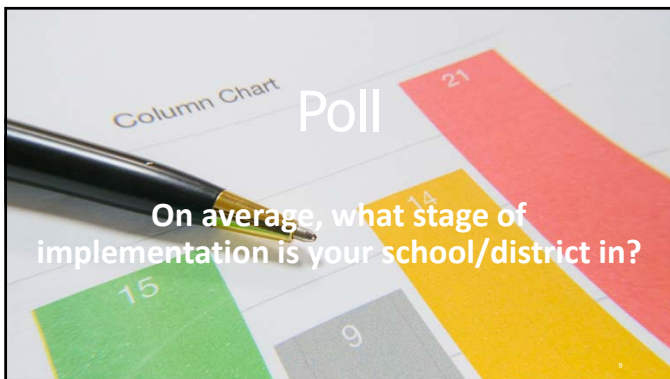

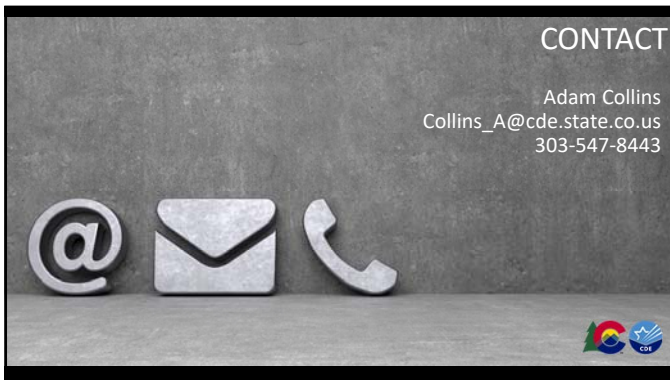
