



Back to School Checklist

Back to School Checklist

Ensure a smooth start to the 2023-24 School Year

This checklist outlines key activities and tools to help sponsors prepare for a successful year. To start:

- · Visit the Events and Program Deadlines webpage for additional deadlines.
- Subscribe to the Dish, School Nutrition's Newsletter, for the latest program updates, reminders and resources.

Renewal Applications

- Submit your applications for the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, and Afterschool Snack Program in the <u>Child Nutrition Portal</u> no later than September 15, 2023. Find detailed application instructions on the <u>How to</u> <u>Apply webpage</u>.
 - Afterschool Snack Program applications may be submitted anytime during the school year.

School Meal Eligibility and Household Income Forms

- <u>Distribute</u>, <u>collect</u>, <u>and process household</u> <u>income applications</u> to determine student eligibility:
 - Sponsors with no eligible Community Eligibility Provision sites: Use the standard free and reduced-price application.
 - Sponsors with some CEP sites: Use the combination form to streamline information collection between all sites.
 - Sponsors with district-wide CEP: Use the <u>FEDS form</u> for household income collection. (optional)
- Complete the first <u>Direct Certification</u> match in the Child Nutrition Portal prior to the first day of school.

Meal Counting & Claiming

- Ensure the Point Of Sale system is set up to claim meals by student eligibility (not required for sites operating CEP)
- If participating in Healthy School Meals for All: ensure the POS is set up so no students will be charged for a meal. Sites not operating CEP must still count students by eligibility.
- Establish internal controls (<u>edit checks</u>)
 to ensure daily meal counts do not
 exceed the number of students eligible or
 in attendance. This will ensure an
 accurate claim for reimbursement is
 submitted. Follow unpaid meal charges
 protocols utilizing the <u>Unpaid Meal</u>
 <u>Charges Flyer</u> and <u>Debt and Donation</u>
 <u>Guidance</u> resources.
- Review the <u>updated meal claiming</u> <u>instructions</u> to ensure you will be prepared to enter claims prior to the deadline.

Serving Preschool Students

 Confirm program eligibility for any preschool students you plan to serve.

Civil Rights

Utilize the <u>Civil Rights Requirements Self-Check</u> to review and document compliance.

Professional Standards

 <u>Track all completed trainings</u> on a training tracker with key area and learning objective codes.

Food Safety

 Contact your local public health agency to request two food safety inspections for the school year.

Resource Management

- Complete the <u>Paid Lunch Equity Tool</u> to ensure the paid meals price meets federal requirements.
- Waived for sponsors participating in Healthy School Meals for All and/or CEP
- Complete the <u>Non-program Revenue Tool</u> to ensure pricing for non-program foods meets federal requirements.

Administrative Reviews and Technical Assistance Visits

 Check the <u>AR and TA cycle</u> to see if you will receive a review or a TA visit this year.

Healthy School Meals for All (HSMA)

- Sponsors participating in HSMA can use the <u>outreach toolkit</u> to share more information with your school community. This toolkit includes talking points on the importance of families providing household income information.
- Sponsors will opt in or out of the program via the renewal application.
 Applications must be submitted by September 15.

CDE School Nutrition Contacts

 Review the <u>Point of Contact list</u> to determine who your CDE point person is for the upcoming school year. Your point person is your go-to person for answers to program questions and support with applications, reviews and technical assistance needs.

Claim submission deadlines for School Year 2023-24

The Child Nutrition reimbursement claim is subject to submission deadlines established by federal regulations. Specifically, a final claim for reimbursement, including revisions, shall be submitted to the state agency no later than 60 calendar days following the last day of the full month covered by the claim. Claims not submitted within 60 calendar days shall not be paid. {7 CFR Part 210.8(b)(1)}.

Claims must be filed on a timely basis to avoid the possibility that a claim would not be payable. It is the sponsor's responsibility to demonstrate timely submission of claims.

Reminder, a claim must show as an "Accepted" status in the CO Child Nutrition Portal (Online Claim System) to ensure timely submission. Claims left in a "Pending", "Incomplete", or "Error" status are not considered complete and will not be paid.
