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Reminders/Updates

- If there are changes to your site's operation, be sure to revise the application and resubmit for approval. Site changes must be approved prior to implementation.
 - Please note that only approved sites are able to participate in the program.

- The Colorado SFSP will be the non-profit of the match for the Colorado Rapids on Friday, June 19 at 7pm. 300 free tickets for kids participating in the SFSP and discounted parent tickets are available. Families will also have the opportunity to participate in the pre-game flag ceremony. Please distribute the attached flyer to kids and families at your sites!

- The FNS is sponsoring a study of summer meal programs that will provide information about program operations, including factors affecting participation and characteristics of summer meal program operators and participants. Starting in May, your organization may be contacted to participate in a webinar and complete a survey (300 will be selected nationwide). Starting in June, 350 sites nationwide will be asked to complete a survey. This is the first official summer meals evaluation since 2003 and final results will be shared in late 2016.

Best Practices

- Hunger Free Colorado is working with Francisco Miraval to gather stories from parents who had their children participate in summer meals last year-- specifically, Latino parents. These stories will be used to help build trust in the program and promote the program through word of mouth, social media and local media. To do so, we need your help to connect with site staff or others who can then help connect with families. - Help spread the word about Colorado PEAK – a tool for Coloradans to sign up for programs that help support their families! Only 57% of eligible families in Colorado are enrolled in SNAP and Colorado PEAK can connect people to SNAP (food stamps), free/low-cost health coverage, financial assistance, and help with child care. The PEAK Outreach Initiative provides FREE brochures, posters, and client cards upon request.
