

Goals of the Grant

- Decrease student/counselor ratios
- Increase graduation rate
- Decrease dropout rate
- Decrease remediation rate
- Increase postsecondary matriculation rate




A Programmatic Way to Look at Change One Circle at a time








So Let's Implement!

Most Important--DATA

- Baseline data from last year—if possible
- Gather data as you go and then archive
- Is it good to have "BAD" results data?
- Keep looking at your Environmental Scan—It can change and should
- What can you change
 - Not goals
 - Only intervention strategies



Strategies you can use

- Timelines for each goal and interventions
- School counselor annual calendar and weekly calendar
- Definite roles and responsibilities
- A schedule for data collection and identified methods for it's use
- Action planning
