Context for Pandemic-Related Transitions







Examples of Pandemic-Related Transitions

Individuals/Families:

- Quarantine due to COVID-19 symptoms or exposure
- At home due to avoid risks of setting sick
- Housing and/or home instabilities

Schools/Districts institute:

- Changed or extended holiday schedules
- Rolling school/program closures
- Hybrid schedules of in-person and remote learning

Communities experience:

Public health
 requirements that affect
 schools, family
 employment,
 transportation options

 Local school districts, in consultation with local public health agencies, determine format of learning contexts.


PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER 20-36 COVID-19 DIAL November 2, 2020

PURPOSE OF THE ORDER

I issue this Public Health Order (PHO or Order) pursuant to the Governor's directive in **Executive Order D 2020 235** in response to the existence of thousands of confirmed and presumptive cases of Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) and related deaths across the State of Colorado. This Order implements levels of restrictions for individuals, businesses and activities to prevent the spread of COVID-19 further in Colorado.

Some families have some control.



Importance of Footnotes

 "Remote testing conditions may be qualitatively different for K-2 students."

 "Approximately one in four students who tested within these schools in fall 2019 are no longer in our sample in fall 2020."







How can schools and districts best support young students' learning?





Back to the basics of child development







Strategies to support young students' fundamental needs

- Prioritize relationship building across all learning contexts
- Provide predictable routines for students (to the extent possible)
- Focus on meeting students' basic needs
- Ensure learning is active and experiential, reflecting the whole child
- Have developmentally informed conversations with students





Double-down on engaging families











Strategies to partner with families

- Recognize and honor the immense stress families are facing
- Communicate early and often, in a streamlined fashion
- Acknowledge and coordinate with their child care needs
- Support and simplify learning at home
- Find ways to stay socially connected and build community





Focus on teacher and staff well-being









Strategies to support teachers and staff

- Prioritize self-care
- Provide professional learning and hands-on support
- Facilitate collaborative teamwork and shared leadership
- Streamline and simplify communications and planning
- Work with their child care needs





Closing
