Preparing for Special Education Mediation



Scheduling

- □ Have several available dates ready to share with the mediator.
- \Box Plan to attend a full day of mediation.
- Decide who should be in attendance, in addition to the Parent and School Administrator with decision-making authority. Will the special education teacher or service provider need to be present? Will an advocate or attorneys need to be present?

Planning

- □ Prepare and prioritize a list of your concerns.
- □ Organize and bring records that support your concerns. Records might include IEPs, evaluations, progress reports, discipline reports, emails, or communications.
- □ List possible solutions, including best possible options and acceptable options.
- □ Keep the focus on the student when brainstorming or thinking about possible solutions.
- □ Prepare a list of questions you hope to have answered and consider questions the other side may ask and how you might respond.

Participation

- □ Mediation is most productive when it is viewed as a collaborative process come with the intent of finding a workable solution.
- □ Come to mediation with an open mind, prepared to listen to the other side's point of view.
- $\hfill\square$ Participation should be honest and courteous.
- □ Express your concerns as clearly as you can and listen respectfully to the other side without interruption.
- \Box Be open to alternative options that could resolve the issues.

Outcome

□ If agreement is reached:

Parties sign a written settlement agreement outlining solutions for each concern.

If parties decide to incorporate the terms of the agreement into the IEP, schedule an IEP meeting.

 \Box If no agreement is reached:

Services will remain the same for the student.

Consider next steps and other available options for resolution, i.e., filing a due process or state complaint.
